## **QUESTAR PIPELINE WILL HOLD OPEN HOUSE TO SEEK PUBLIC COMMENT ON SYSTEM EXPANSION PROPOSAL**

SALT LAKE CITY — Questar Pipeline Company (QPC) officials will host an open house to elicit public comment on the company's proposed Southern System Expansion Project. The meeting will be from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 10, at the Price, Utah, Holiday Inn, 838 Westwood Blvd.

QPC is seeking public comments that the company will address in a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) as part of its application for Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) approval for the project. QPC's proposed project includes construction of about 18.4 miles of 24-inch diameter pipeline and two compressor stations, and upgrades to two existing compressor stations. Project activities would occur at various sites in Utah and Colorado.

The new section of pipeline would be generally adjacent to QPC's existing Main Line (M.L.) No. 40, which runs east to west north of Price. It would begin about 14 miles east of Price in Soldier Creek Canyon (one-half mile south of Soldier Creek Mine) and end four miles west of U.S. Highway 6 near an existing QPC valve facility.

The proposed 9,400-horsepower Water Canyon Compressor Station would be built adjacent to M.L. No. 40 in Duchesne County. The 5,800-horsepower Thistle Creek Compressor Station would be constructed adjacent to QPC's M.L. No. 41 in Utah County just north of Indianola. In addition, modifications are proposed within the fenced yards of QPC's Oak Spring Compressor Station in Carbon County, Utah, and the Greasewood Compressor Station in Rio Blanco County, Colo.

Construction of the pipeline and additional compression would add about 102,000 decatherms of natural gas capacity per day to QPC's existing transmission system.

The open house will include a project-proposal overview, a question-and-answer session, as well as an opportunity for interested members of the public to comment on the proposal. Verbal comments will be recorded. All public comments, verbal and written, and QPC's responses will be included in the company's draft EA, which will accompany its FERC application. Assuming FERC approval, QPC plans to begin construction for the proposed expansion in May 2005 with a target completion date of October 2005.
